

PRINCIPALS REPORT

Welcome back to Belmont!!

We have been busy beavers over the break with lots of work completed or started.

- Air Conditioners have been installed in the Prep room and Office. Pigeons are still hanging around, even though their home (AC unit) outside has gone.
- Election has come and gone but the school enjoyed a VERY successful Sausage Sizzle and Cake stall thanks to many of our committed parents. More details later in this newsletter.
- One student girls toilet is out of action. We have had an ongoing leak for some time at a cost of an internal plaster wall so far....
- 3/4E large sliding door fixed and wall trim reglued.

Frog fundraiser

On the last day of term Junior School Council held a Green Frog Day to help raise our awareness of the plight of frogs across the world. The problem of chemical use and general human impact on frogs is leading to a significant decline in populations across the world.

We raised a total of \$ 368.20 which will be donated to an Australian based group called 'Frog safe'.

Feedback responses

Our **Seesaw APP** at this stage is being rolled out across our Prep to Year 4. We have received plenty of great feedback about this new way of communicating and sharing with our parents.

A **Prep pergola** is a great idea. The challenge of course with any good idea is meeting the cost of materials and once roofed, the necessary permits and building regulations which may then apply. We have large sections of our aging roof on our 160 year old main building which may be a first priority.

The good news is that several **incursions** are booked for this term across many grade levels. The first of these is for our Prep-2 next Monday with the RACV visiting.

The **oval** continues to be a work in progress. We have further plans for this area later this year we hope. Currently it is very wet and sodden.

We know our **drinking taps** have been misbehaving. We took time to investigate if the recurring problems were serviceable and they are not. This last holidays we have replaced three and will see how this new tap type performs before replacing any more.

TV shows and or **movies** are not routinely used across the term and usually do make an appearance in the final days of each term to allow staff necessary time to sort, plan and clean areas. There are regular shows like BTN or series like David Attenborough which are wonderful programs for students highly educational and provide rich discussion which might be confused for movies.

The school takes **unexplained absences** seriously and our new software program COMPASS is providing the school with better data sets which help guide our work with a small number of families.

I will endeavour to provide a brief overview of **School Council** discussions in future newsletters following our monthly meetings. School Council next meet in August.

A **challenge** for the holidays was to create a 'sculpture'. This could be <u>made from anything at all</u> using any combination of materials. Wood, clay, vegies, recycled items and any size that can fit in the family car. We will organise a special showing next week. We have 13 entries so far. This was a challenge idea from a parent. FORMULA 1 AT BPS NEW GRADE 5/6 UNIT OF WORK FOR TERM 3

The F1 Schools Technology Challenge is the world's largest secondary school technology program. It involves over nine million students from 17,000 schools in 31 nations. F1 in Schools is a holistic action learning program which focuses on developing long term employability skills. Students learn leadership, team building, project management, business planning, public speaking, marketing, collaboration, and writing and presentation skills.

All teams will visit Deakin CADET to learn about specific sciences around design and human reaction time.

Teams will be made up of five students, each student will have a specific roll in the team

- Team Leader
- Team Engineer
- Team Graphic Design
- Team Marketing
- Team Presentation

Teams are required to

- Design a car based on a card board base with freedom to do what they want on the body design so long as they stay within a minimum weight limit
- Develop and display a post A1 size that clearly shows all Design, development and testing.
 Provides team back ground and identity.
- Create a unique team uniform based on a plain t-shirt that will be designed by students.
- Deliver a presentation that shows the teams learning.

Each team member will lead the team in each of their specific areas to achieve that goal.

We look forward to our schools involvement in this great new and innovative unit of work.


